

12/18/19 Applications being accepted for Guardianship Examining Committee.

Applications are currently being accepted for new members of the Court's Guardianship Examining Committee. The Guardianship Examining Committee consists of qualified professionals and lay persons who make an assessment in regard to an alleged incapacitated person and report to the Court, to assist the Court in making a determination as to that person's ability to exercise certain legal rights. Our Committee is especially in need of additional physician members at this time.

The work product of the Examining Committee is an essential consideration of the Guardianship Court, before declaring a person to be legally incapacitated, in whole or in part, and before removing any of that person's rights and, potentially, delegating some of those rights to a legal guardian.

Appointments to the Committee are made each year by the Chief Judge or his designee. Applications are only accepted for a limited time annually. A completed Application is required, along with a résumé reflecting relevant experience, and a Confidential Notice of Social Security Number, so that a criminal background check can be completed electronically. Those appointed to the Committee are subject to both initial and ongoing training requirements.

Payment for the services of an Examining Committee Member is made in accordance with the applicable Administrative Order(s) of this Court.
